Evidence concerning differences in capabilities to realize aspirations is prevalent. Whether one considers the labor market as a whole, or one focuses on specific segments, disparities in the probability of "success" between men and women exist despite decades of efforts to eradicate them. We all clearly need to learn more about the causes and the consequences of these disparities. Gender Gaps Conference is an annual event for scholars interested in this field. The theme for 2022 will be flexibility in working time arrangements as well as equality in reaching aspirations.

Conference Venue

The conference will be at the <u>Tyszkiewicz-Potocki Palace</u>, in the main campus of the University of Warsaw. The Palace is located in <u>ul. Krakowskie Przedmieście 26/28</u>. This is within walking distance from metro station Nowy Świat – Uniwersytet.

Format of the conference

There are two types of sessions:

In short sessions, presenters will have 20 minutes to share their research. The discussant will then have 5 minutes to comment on the research. Finally, we will open the floor for questions and comments. Short sessions are indicated in the program.

In long sessions, presenters will have 30 minutes followed by a 10 minute discussion, and 5 minutes for questions.

Social Dinner

Presenters and discussants are invited to an informal dinner on the first day of the conference. The dinner will be at "Prosty Temat" (ul. Szpitalna 1) and will start at roughly 19:00. The restaurant is located 15 minutes away from the conference venue.
